Open possibilities:

Studies in ministry can open up careers in chaplaincy (school, aged care, hospital, workplace), pastoral care, ordained ministry, teaching religious education or biblical studies in church or Christian schools (DipEd or BEd required), and other careers with tertiary study prerequisites. Combined Arts/Theology degrees are available through CCTC and Monash University.
