WHO WE ARE

OUR LOCAL COMMUNITY

Echuca-Moama is a vibrant twin river town in regional Victoria / New South Wales. Echuca-Moama has a combined population of around 21,000 people and is located 220km from Melbourne and 90km from Bendigo. Our town is a growing regional centre and is supported by a strong tourist industry. This often means the population can easily double over the holiday periods, as people come to access the Murray River.

OUR CHURCH

New Life Baptist is a well established church in Echuca/Moama. We are a welcoming community of believers who meet together to worship and encourage each other to know Christ and make him known within our community.

Our church first began as a church plant from the simultaneous requests from nearby pastors to establish a Baptist church in the Echuca-Moama region. On June 19th, 2005, the church had its first official gathering under the name Echuca-Moama Baptist Church. The church was initially led by Geoff Leslie from Barham and Paul Manning from Deniliquin who shared the role of nurturing the church in its formative years. Earle Prentice led the church for two years from 2006-2008. Following this, Matt Hill pastored the next two years. During this season the church began to decline and a new leader was sought.

In September 2011, Jono Schroder was called to pastor the church. It was at this time the church became known as New Life as a reflection of the new beginnings of the church. The church flourished during Jono's ministry and an Associate Pastor, Donovan Jasper was appointed in 2018. In December 2019, Jono was called to lead Axis church in Brisbane.

As of 2020, around 100 people call New Life their home church, and we usually see up to 80 people worshipping on any given Sunday morning. New Life has a contemporary style of worship. We regularly offer prayer at the end of our worship gatherings and have numerous people experienced in prayer ministry. New Life has a history of engaging with both those who have conservative and contemporary tastes alike.

WHAT WE BELIEVE

OUR BELIEFS

The Bible: We acknowledge the Bible as God's Word and our supreme authority for faith, life and ministry. We strive to teach the Bible with integrity and authority so seekers find Christ and believers grow to maturity in Him. (2 Timothy 3:16).

Prayer: We believe prayer is a vital expression of our relationship with God and our dependence on His grace. We rely on personal and corporate prayer in the conception, planning and implementation of all the ministries and activities of our church. (Matthew 7:7-11).

The Family: We esteem marriage and the family as God's primary units for a healthy and just society. Though families come in many forms they need to be regulated by God's Word. We endeavor to nurture and strengthen marriage and the family as fundamental to the health and effectiveness of our church.

The Holy Spirit and His gifts: We acknowledge our absolute dependence on the Holy Spirit, His grace and gifts. We hold to the priesthood of all believers; Christ's gifts to the church (Ephesians 4:7-11); and we seek to assist people identify and use their God-given gifts (1 Corinthians 12, 14, Romans 12) for the building up of the body of Christ.

A Worshiping community: We seek through different worship styles to provide services that people want to attend, not through a sense of duty but because it is a joyous and inspiring experience which brings glory to God. We value worship that is contemporary, culturally relevant, celebratory and consistent with our commitment to Biblical integrity and life transforming mission.

Unity Within Diversity: We believe God is the creator of diversity and the source of all unity. He likens His church to a body with many parts. Sunday Gatherings

We aim to provide church gatherings that are relevant to everyday life, in a friendly and relaxed atmosphere. We aim to teach inspiring messages from the Bible to help people grow in their faith. We purposefully make our gatherings practical and accessible for people who are new to church and we happily acknowledge we are all still learning and growing together! Each Sunday we gather for a time of prayer before the commencement of our worship service at 10:30. We have a healthy number of church partners who are involved in leading including vocal leaders and musicians. Our music style is mostly contemporary. Our meeting time normally runs for just over an hour, which includes a program for children aged two to upper primary school age, with a 'cuppa' straight after. We have a communion focus the first Sunday of each month.

We have wheelchair access, & hearing receivers for the hearing impaired.

Equip Home Groups

At New Life, we exist to help people become disciples of Jesus Christ, and thus exhibit the qualities Jesus displayed, like: love, joy, peace, kindness and patience. We realise becoming like Jesus is a life-long ambition; we are "broken becoming whole". Although this means we are far from perfect, we are on the journey of becoming more Christ-like each day! Our weekly meeting together in homes is to support one another in this quest.

Our equip groups are not considered to be 'holy huddles'. We recognize that to truly follow Jesus leads us back into the world, to spread the message of reconciliation (see 2 Corinthians 5:18-20). So our equip groups are designed to equip us to participate in God's mission and become useful contributors to that great cause. We also hold a weekly prayer meeting every Thursday, which everyone is welcome to attend.

Buildings / Venue

We don't currently have our own building. Three years ago, New Life transitioned from its small council rented facility into a larger basketball stadium, still in Moama. Being in the bigger facility means we have plenty of room to grow, as we move into the future. At present we pay around \$140 for our Sunday morning hire to the Murray River Council, which has been very economical for us. However we are open to moving to another facility to better suit our needs, provides opportunity for further growth and is financially viable.

Church Camp

Each year we kick off the year with a church camp. Over the past few years our camps have been held at camp Wilkins in Anglesea. These camps have been a valuable time of encouragement and have been a source of fostering greater unity in our church.

Special Services

Easter and Christmas Eve services are special events. Personal invitations go out from church partners as well as on social media and are attended by many visitors. The children stage a wonderful drama and the Gospel message is presented in an accessible way. The service is rounded off with a fellowship meal, which is shared and enjoyed by all.

Ecumenical Involvement

At New Life we value demonstrating the unity of the body of Christ by partnering with other local churches in our interaction with our local community. This includes; participating in our local Ministers Association and coordinating and contributing to the weekly 'Crossroads' column in our local newspaper, welcoming youth from other churches to our youth group and girl's group, and partnering on community outreach initiatives like Foodbank. We also have a close relationship with the local Salvation Army and regularly use their facilities for various ministry activities throughout the week.

Youth Ministry

Although we only have a few teenagers in our congregation, our Associate Pastor and a number of youth leaders from New Life run a thriving combined churches youth group every second Friday evening at the River City Christian College school hall. This youth group is currently the only active youth group in Echuca/Moama, and young people from many different churches in our community attend. A girl's discipleship group is also held every second week.

MINISTRIES ...

Children's Ministry

We have a dedicated team of Sunday school teachers and parent helpers who run a Sunday school program each week during the sermon time. Children are in church with their parents for the beginning of the service. Sunday school is for children ages 3 years, to Grade 6, and runs every Sunday year round, including during the school holidays.



Mainly Music

Each Thursday we run "mainly music" a fun music group for parents or primary caregivers to enjoy with their young child. Each session runs for 30 minutes and children are introduced to music creativity and more. A number of young mothers and their children attend this program from the local community. This has been a great way to connect with new mothers in the community and has organically led to some mothers keen to study the bible!

Women's Ministry

Our vision for the women of New Life is to see each of us grow and love Jesus more each day; to spur each other on to love, holiness and good deeds and to encourage and nurture each other in our walk with Christ. In 2020 we created multi-generational prayer & care triplets, with each triplet currently reading through the book of Galatians one chapter a week and discussing it, praying for each other and extending accountability, wisdom and encouragement to one another.

Men's Ministry

The men have a variety of events throughout the year with the aim of creating opportunities for fellowship and encouragement. There is a bi-monthly coffee/breakfast where a short devotion is shared and an evening event held on alternate months. These events are planned to allow men to come together and also to invite friends. Some of these activities have been bush camping, clay target shooting, movie nights, working bees, and attending the regional men's muster.

Pastoral Care

We have a team who coordinate the Pastoral Care to our church. This includes supporting those who are grieving the loss of a loved one, rejoicing in the birth of a new child and supporting families going through sickness and other stresses. We aim to bring God's comfort and love into each situation, including prayer for those in these circumstances. We encourage our church family to be involved in caring for one another.

LEADERSHIP

New Life's leadership is made up of leaders elected by church partners. The leadership term is an appointment for three years and ongoing if re-elected. Our church has a leadership driven structure and decisions are predominantly made by the Leadership Team. However, with more significant decisions we incorporate congregational input via our church partners. We currently have a diverse group of six leaders on our Leadership Team, each bringing their unique gifts and talents to serve the church.

We have an annual AGM, which is a celebration of the year gone by, but usually no other regular church meetings. This is rather unique for a Baptist context, but reflective of our constitution being formed in recent times. Information is disseminated to Church partners on a regular basis via email including a quarterly financial update. Information is communicated to the wider congregation via weekly emails using MailChimp, Facebook posts, and as part of Sunday services.

As a leadership group we see great value in attending leadership conferences, such as the Global Leadership Summit (GLS) where we are inspired and challenged to grow. We have attended this conference for the past 5 years. Last year we encouraged all of our ministry leaders to attend the GLS to support and increase their leadership capacity.

LEADERSHIP ...

Current Staff

In 2018, the church leadership began the process of developing a second staff position to share some of the load, alongside the expectation of further growth. In February 2019, New Life appointed Donovan Jasper as a full-time Associate Pastor. Donovan is married to Rebekah and they have 2 young children.

Donovan took on three main areas being Next Generation, Worship and Missions. The intention was that this second pastor would spend the majority of their time on outward community focuses, to fulfill the church's dream of establishing a community hub. This community hub vision was birthed at a church vision day in 2016 (see future ministry and direction section). Donovan's appointment was intended to help facilitate that dream becoming a reality. However, with the departure of the Senior Pastor and the current Covid-19 pandemic situation, Donovan's time and focus has been spent in other directions and priorities.

Financial Position

Since 2012 the Church's finances have been steadily growing each year, with around a 10-fold increase in total. For 2018-2019, our giving towards missions was nearly \$19,000, an area that has also grown significantly over the years.

In 2017 New Life established a 'Future Fund' account, capitalizing on a portion of the Church's money by investing it in an account providing a credit interest return. The Future Fund has also had contributions through generous donations and now sits at around \$270, 000. We are thankful for the blessing of being able to grow our finances and believe that we will be equipped for God's leading into the future.

MISSIONAL ENGAGEMENT

MISSIONAL SUPPORT

At New Life we have a heart for mission and we have a three-pronged focus reflecting the Acts 1:8 model given by Jesus (Jerusalem, Judea and then the ends of the earth). In other words, mission always starts in our own backyard first; then spreads from there. We dream of making a difference in every sphere in Jesus name! We are blessed to partner with a number of missions locally, regionally and worldwide. Each month we focus on raising support for one of our partners through Mission 25 - our mission support initiative. We currently support the following causes:

Care packs: New Life provides a number of care packs that are distributed to those more vulnerable in our community to the local hospital, Anglicare, Crossenvale Community House and Twin Rivers Primary School. The pack contents vary depending on the need but can include hygiene/toiletry products, a Gideon's new testament, mints, a colouring activity for kids or baby items for new mothers.

C's Camps: A Christian camping program established in our region, which runs a number of camps catering for all ages from primary school, teenage, men's, women's, and marriage camps. The guiding principle for each camp is to move each person to a greater understanding of God's love and purpose for their lives.

MISSIONAL SUPPORT...

Teen Challenge: A Christian centered, addiction rehabilitation centre for men based in Kyabram. We partner with Teen Challenge through working bees, and fellowship several times a year, where the men share their testimony, share a meal and are encouraged and prayed for. Whilst on leave break from the centre some men have been blessed with the provision of short term housing and mentoring by some of our church partners.

Southern Cross Kids Camp: A Christian organization providing annual camps to children from abused and neglected environments. The programs are designed to bring fun and laughter back into the lives of children whose everyday existence is less than ideal. A number of our church partners have been involved in leadership and volunteering as “buddies” on these camps.

The Davey Family: Cam and Jess Davey are a local family now serving with pioneers in Sri Lanka at the Colombo theological seminary. They have four beautiful children and Cam is currently serving as a teacher / lecturer at the seminary.

MISSIONAL SUPPORT...

Child Sponsorship: We sponsor three children in Sri Lanka through Baptist world aid. The youth group is also engaged in this mission by sponsoring a child. It has been wonderful to engage the youth group in sponsoring a child and see their generosity grow.

Community Outreach: Community outreach incorporates SRE and the local food bank. We seek to be involved in supporting our local community to be a part of Christ's restorative change in our local region. SRE is run at Moama primary school where we have a welcome and healthy relationship with the school. We have a number of SRE teachers that volunteer in this area.



MISSIONAL ENGAGEMENT

Our Community and Mission

For a number of years now, New Life has been praying and discerning God's leading towards our mission to our local community. We seek to provide healing and hope in our community, through Christ and for Christ, demonstrating and inviting people into a "New Life" with Christ. We have dreamed of the possibility of opening a community hub where we can combine practical assistance with holistic Gospel outreach, however we have been unclear yet on what this looks like for Echuca-Moama.

In October 2019, we were offered the opportunity to take over the Moama Op Shop. After praying and considering the offer, we decided that this was an opportunity to try out something new in the community outreach space and committed to a six-month trial. Thanks to a committed team of volunteers we started the process of transforming the shop from a fairly cluttered trash & treasure stall into a bright, spacious and well-ordered show-room for pre-loved goods. Despite the commitment of our volunteers, it became clear that we needed a dedicated manager to oversee the running of the shop and at the beginning of February a part-time manager was appointed. Sadly, the onset of the COVID-19 restrictions brought an early end to our trial period, forcing closure in March. It was decided at the end of the trial not to continue once restrictions ease. We are thankful for the wonderful opportunities that the humble little shop presented us in being able to connect with people in our community as a contact point for our church during the week.

Next Steps...

We have begun preliminary meetings with a number of other local churches looking at the possibility of partnering together to provide a local foodbank service after a long-term local Christian provider closed. We also have a strong relationship with the local Salvation Army branch and have had conversations about partnering with them as they hope to expand their welfare support service into a broader community hub and outreach service.

FUTURE MINISTRIES AND DIRECTION

Future Ministry and Direction

New Life continues to steadily grow numerically, as well as financially. We seek to be a church that creatively meets the needs of our current community who are New Life Baptist Church and see God's kingdom extended further in the wider community. In 2016, Christine Wanstall, BUV Church health consultant, was invited to facilitate a visioning process for the church. The church leadership, along with input from church partners, developed a broad outline of a 10-year dream, as summarized below:

The Church will:

- Be a passionate group of Jesus followers bringing real change to the broken and being a shining light to the community
- Be a safe place being relevant to meet community needs
- Have numerous part-time staff
- Grow people but also see harvest
- Have a real impact on our community with real people
- Grow in membership - 500 members, not a mega-church but one where there would be a core community in the town with branches into the surrounding communities

A community hub which:

- Is holistic
- Provides God-centred teaching
- Offers counselling & mentoring
- Provides a support centre with food & shelter

Future Ministry and Direction

The following six areas were identified as being core to our strategic plan:

Mentoring: We value the role in helping each other develop and deepen our spiritual faith. Including developing spiritual gifts.

Prayer: The foundation of our Church & all we do is based in prayer.

Community hub: we want to impact our local community for Christ.

Next generation development: We recognise the need to continually raise and inspire the next generation.

Mission / sending: We recognise the need to be outward focussed in our faith.

Deepening relationships: We value community and recognise the strength in having fun and deepening relationships.

PASTORAL PRIORITIES

Pastoral Priorities 2020 and Beyond

New Life wants to build upon the ministries we currently have whilst continuing to grow and move toward new areas. We believe that we have some exciting growth opportunities, particularly in the area of local community mission with a grander vision of opening a community hub.

In our Senior Pastor we are looking for someone who can lead and support the church in the following key areas:

- We love Biblical teaching and preaching and it is a truly valued part of our Sunday Service. We are seeking a Pastor who can communicate God's message about Jesus (the Gospel) in a way that draws a response, so that people have a practical and relational understanding of Biblical truths and are enabled to grow in the Holy Spirit's leading.
- We want to build our love, connection and care of our church and local community through pastoral care. We are seeking a Pastor who can help the church to continue to grow in being a community in which people feel valued and cared for.
- We place a real importance and focus on bible study, prayer, spiritual development and the discipleship of our church congregation and those we are in community with. We are seeking a Pastor who can nurture us as disciples of Jesus and help the Church to abide more closely with God and who can cultivate an environment in which people of different life experiences can grow their faith in Jesus.
- We highly value Godly Leadership within the Church. We are seeking a Pastor with an ability to identify, develop, equip and mentor leadership, both current and potential. We are also seeking a Pastor who creates an atmosphere of teamwork where every person in the church family is valued and actively encouraged to use their gifts and abilities for the benefit of all.

PASTORAL PRIORITIES

Pastoral Attributes

We as a church discern that the following are **essential attributes** of a Senior Pastor to guide and lead us in these key areas:

- Has a sense of call
- Is visionary and strategic in their leadership
- A team player
- Has a pastoral heart
- Is a competent preacher and teacher, theologically trained, communicates well at a personal and group level
- Devoted to the bible
- Prayerful
- Has a growing relationship with God and also has a heart for mission

It is **desirable** that our new Senior Pastor:

- Has previous pastoral experience
- Relates warmly to people both in Church and community (ecumenically supportive)
- Is evangelistic
- Recognizes spiritual gifting and is an equipper of people
- Well organized
- Has a sense of humour
- Has a consultative leadership style that is open to advice

PASTORAL POSITION

The Position

The church is offering the new Senior Pastor:

- Full-time, fixed term up to five years, with annual reviews
- Regular work days to be negotiated
- The recommended BUV Stipend 100% (manse not included), subject to experience
 - 50% Cash
 - 50% Tax Exempt Fringe Benefit
- The recommended BUV Superannuation of 11.91% (2020) church contribution
- Home office benefit
- Ministry allowance for internet and phone expenses
- Computer (desktop or laptop) as negotiated
- Relocation expenses negotiable
- Accommodation will not be provided for the pastor/ pastor's family

Leave provisions offered:

- Annual Leave: five weeks per year (cumulative)
- Rest and Restoration Leave: one week per year (non-cumulative)
- Personal / Carer's Leave: 10 days per year (cumulative)
- Long Service Leave: in accordance with the Victorian LSL Act 1992
- Professional Development Leave: minimum of 40 contact hours per year
- Public Holidays: official Victorian public holidays. Time in lieu is negotiable when required to work a public holiday such as Christmas and an alternative day off is not a viable option

PASTORAL POSITION

New Life Baptist Church is a healthy, growing church, aspiring to be Christ-like disciples, relying on the Holy Spirit, to know God and make Him known throughout our local community. It is our mission to demonstrate the love of Christ to those around us, sharing the Good News Gospel and the New Life that Jesus invites all into.

We are prayerfully confident and excited in God's leading and preparation for our new Senior Pastor, who shares our mission and will lead us in God's journey for our Church.

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APPENDIX

HISTORY OF NEW LIFE

In an incredible twist of circumstances in 2004, Dr. David Jones, a consultant with the Baptist Union of NSW received simultaneous requests from both Geoff Leslie at Barham Baptist Church and Paul Manning at Deniliquin Baptist Church to survey the Moama area in view of planting a church. Although not knowing each other at the time, Barham Pastor, Geoff, had some connections with people in Echuca-Moama area, and Deniliquin Pastor, Paul, was appointed at Deniliquin two years prior with a condition that he supported a future church plant in Moama. God had already been at work to form what would later become a unique partnership!

Upon conducting formal research into the region, David felt that the area would greatly benefit from having a Baptist church presence and he recommended that the Baptist Union of NSW consider planting a church in Moama, a recommendation they happily accepted. Being a border town, they decided to form a partnership with the Baptist Union of Victoria and both unions graciously agreed to combine resources in their support of a new church plant at Moama.

On June 19th, 2005, the church had its first official Sunday gathering, under the name of Echuca-Moama Baptist Church. With no appointed church planter at this time, Geoff & Paul took turns to travel over each Sunday, from Barham & Deniliquin respectively. They both generously offered their time and energy to nurture the church and help it establish core values. David also remained actively involved during this time, helping the church find its first church planter in 2006, when Earle & Liz Prentice came to lead the church for its first two years of existence. We acknowledge the support of the Baptist Union to help resource the church during this time, without which it couldn't have been established. Along with those already mentioned above, some others that played key roles in the church's early history are: Dean & Julie Stublely (as treasurer), Robert & Pauline Arnold (as consultant), Matt & Kate Hill (as pastor), and Jeff & Sue Kraak (as treasurer), of whom we are very grateful for their contributions.

APPENDIX

HISTORY OF NEW LIFE...

In September 2011, Jono & Yvonne Schroder took on pastoral leadership of the church. After completing a theological degree with Australian College of Ministries (ACOM), Jono served as the church's pastor and led the church through a time of transition, where in October 2012, the church became known as New Life, a name which appropriately fitted the new and exciting season that God was taking the church.

In May 2014, New Life Baptist Church was officially recognised as a fully constituted church of the Baptist Union of Victoria. The church continued to grow and develop to the point, where in February 2019, Donovan & Rebekah Jasper were called to Echuca-Moama. Having recently completed a master of divinity, Donovan was employed as a full-time associate pastor, with a view to head up community outreach. Jono continued serving the church as the Senior Pastor.
