### **DEVOTION 1:**

#### **A Transformed Perspective: Setting Our Face Toward Jerusalem**

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In Luke 9:51, we see a profound turning point in the life and ministry of Jesus. He “resolutely set out for Jerusalem,” fully aware of what awaited him—rejection, suffering, and death on a cross. Yet, beyond the pain lay victory, resurrection, and the fulfillment of God’s redemptive plan. This pivotal moment is not just about geography; it’s about purpose. Jesus’ unwavering determination reflects a commitment to God’s mission of transformation and salvation.

As we approach Palm Sunday and the celebration of Jesus’ triumphant entry, it is vital to first pause and reflect on this deliberate journey toward the cross. For it is in his determined march to Jerusalem that we see the heart of discipleship and transformation.

## Study Questions

How can you better align your life with Christ's mission of love, hope, and transformation? Who else can you encourage in their discipleship journey?

Just as Jesus journeyed to bring salvation and new life, we are called to be agents of change and hope. In what practical ways can you reflect Christ's love and bring healing and transformation to those around you—whether at home, work, church, school, sports clubs or your neighbourhood?
